COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

Native Animal Care/Rescue: during 1999-2000 I completed a number of courses with WIRES (Wildlife Information and Rescue Service) including basic training, possums and lizards. I am a licenced animal carer with NSW Parks and Wildlife.

Blue Folk Community Arts Association: for five years I was an active member of this Association, which runs group activities to encourage all age groups to develop their artistic potential. I was the Group Leader at the Blue Folk Homestead, where children made costumes and creatures to fit the weekly theme (circus, medieval village, Indian tribe). In addition I gave basic instruction in games, pottery, spinning, silk screening and acting.

Drama/Music/Percussion: I have acting, singing and playing experience. In 1982 I attended a workshop with Aldo Gennaro designed to stimulate personal growth, body awareness, coordination and concentration in the intellectually disabled individual. This led me to produce and direct the Chapman Hostel Musical Review at the AGSOMD Conference.

I participated in a 20 week percussion workshop run at TAU Theatre based on the idea of using percussion as a music therapy, and have used these skills in live performance in a group called Los Immigrantes. Until 1991 I was also the manager of a reggae band The Wailing Cockatoos.

Radio: Trained in Community Radio Announcing and Management at 2XX Community Radio Station. Participated in another Announcer Training course run by EAR Public Radio Moruya. Involved in organising and setting up lobby group for Public Access Radio and a Community Newspaper in the Bega Valley.

Video & Photography: I have studied video editing and production with Independent Video, and have worked as a production assistant on numerous productions for Independent Video and LOWeANGLE Productions. My voiceover work includes various documentaries and community service advertisements for Pedal Power (broadcast locally), Conflict Resolution Service (broadcast locally) and Red Cross First Aid Education (broadcast nationally). Employers in this area include EMU Productions, the Instructional Resources Unit (IRU), Howe Electronics, Animagic Animation and LOWeANGLE Productions.

In 1993 I won first prize in the B & W section of the Photo Focus Photography Competition (open to all ACT Tertiary students) for *Now*? Another photograph, *Cloud Boy* was also chosen for exhibition.

Film Production: I have been involved as Director's Assistant in two short films produced through the Australian Film Television and Radio School, *Freestyle* and *The Two Wheeled Time Machine*.
